Monarchs




It can take up to three generations for monarchs to complete their travel cycle from Canada to Mexico, and back.



The monarch butterfly is one of the most observed species during the Big Backyard BioBlitz. It only breeds in habitats with native milkweed; the only plant its caterpillars can eat. Breeding and feeding habitats include prairies and meadows.



Monarchs are pollinators. They help plants produce seeds and grow fruit by transferring pollen from one plant to another.






Colour by number
